Description

Early C17 irregularly planned small country house possibly incorporating earlier building. Coursed limestone rubble with gabled old clay tile roof. Two storeys and attics. A small number of original leaded casements survive. Most of the windows belong to the C19 remodelling of the house and are sashes with glazing bars. In the early C19 the moulded parapet, finials and classical porch of early C17 date were brought from Easton Maudit in Northamptonshire and used on the main front. Also from Easton Maudit are the two double-transomed windows to the garden elevation. The interior of the house was also extensively remodelled in C19. In the ballroom there is the remains of an early stone fireplace but the timber ceiling with carved flower bosses and the sculpted figures on the walls are C19. Even the Jacobean-style staircase is mainly reproduction.

Description

Mediaeval parish church with additions and alterations 1852-1854 by Sir G. G. Scott. His work has been called "the finest mid-Victorian ecclesiastical ensemble in Bedfordshire" (McHardy). Church consists of nave, chancel, W. tower, N. and S. aisles and S. porch. W. part of the nave has remains of probably Saxon work as does the base of the tower. Tower arch and central stages are Early English; the parapet and pyramid roof, Victorian. The nave is mainly C13 with the N. arcade added early C14 and the nave extended. Most of the windows were reworked by Scott. C15 clerestorey and fine angel roof. S. porch is also C15. It was originally vaulted. S. doorway has good C13 ironwork similar to that at Leighton Buzzard and Eaton Bray. The chancel was rebuilt by Scott 1852-54. In a recess in the S. aisle is an early C14 painting of the Crucifixion. There is an impressive collection of monuments. Two C15 brasses in the S. chapel. In the S. aisle a tomb-chest of Sir John Mordaunt 1506. Between chancel and S. chapel, one of the most important Tudor monuments in the county (Pevsner), to the first Lord Mordaunt 1560. It is by T. Kirby. Alabaster effigies and stone surround. Coupled Roman Doric columns and an arch decorated with chains of squares and circles. Victories in the spandrels. The upper storey has two caryatids. Also 2nd Lord Mordaunt and his two wives. Effigies lie side by side, but he is raised higher than his wives. 3rd Lord Mordaunt 1601. An unusual tomb-chest with a black cloth of stone hanging down like a pall and the inscription in white on it.

Description

Small country house. 1793-4 entrance front with top storey added probably c1830 when the garden front was built. Stucco. Welsh slate roof. Three storeys. Garden front of seven bays with central and end bays carried forward. End bays have fluted Corinthian two storey columns flanking first floor window with bas relief frieze, ground floor window with Corinthian columns and broken entablature. Central bay has fluted pilasters with anthemion capitals. Over first floor, large entablature with foliated frieze, dentil and mutule cornice. Attic storey above has smaller dentil cornice, blocking course with central and end scroll pediments, the central one topped by a large anthemion motif. Ground floor windows have architrave surrounds, ribbed consoles supporting cornices. First floor windows have eared architraves, bas relief panel over central window, which has corn ear mouldings to frieze. Second floor windows have moulded surrounds. South West front terrace with balustraded parapet. To right hand side recessed tower, later two storey wing. North front has tetrastyle Doric porch to pedimented central projection, slight end projections of facade, all c.1793 except attic storey of earlier C19. Cylindrical lantern, visible over attic, lights dome of staircase hall. Interior has coffered dome to staircase hall with first floor apse (over entrance hall) of semi-circular plan with fluted Corinthian columns and ribbed dome. Drawing room has panelled ceiling and serpentine chimneypiece with console supports.

No 1 is two bays, No 2 also two bays originally, with third small bay added to north end. East elevation: first floor four C20 casement windows. Ground floor of No 1 has two doorways to left hand side and one 3-light casement. No 2 has two 2-light case-ments with glazing bars flanking central doorway with flat bracketed doorhood. Third bay has archway and single light casement with glazing bars.
